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## Scenario - Family affected by diabetes

### Level 2 - Clinical information

Nuclear family

Ethnic origin South Asian

Mother, Housewife aged 60

Father Shopkeeper aged 64

Son, Lorry Driver, aged 42

Daughter in law aged 33 part time works in family shop

One male child aged 8

Mother, Housewife aged 60 she has a BMI of 28, has hypertension and cholesterol of 5.5, she takes little exercise apart from short walks.

Father Shopkeeper aged 64 Type 2 diabetes He has recurrent neuro-ischaemic ulceration to 2<sup>nd</sup> metatarsal .The father has a BMI of 28; currently his HbA1c is 7.8 he is hypertensive and smokes. Initially he was prescribed Metformin and then in addition a sulphonylurea but as his HbA1c rose from 8.2 to 10.4 he was initiated onto insulin, he likes to supplement this with some herbal treatment.



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Son, Lorry Driver, aged 42 has type 2 diabetes with a BMI of 32, his HbA1c is 8.5. For his diabetes control initially he was prescribed Metformin recently Gliclazide was added.

He has recently developed symptoms of erectile dysfunction, the couple have been trying for second child for 4 years but he has suffered from recurrent balanitis causing him discomfort. Recently he has also been experiencing some problems with his eyesight but is reticent to have an eye test.

Male Child aged 8 has autism, and he is overweight on the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile

Daughter in law aged 33

She has a BMI of 23, and is normotensive. However, she has suffered from epilepsy since her teens for which she takes carbamazepine, the prescribing history prior to coming to England is not known, and currently she is subject to low moods.



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
